How lucky we are to have such a great facility that we can bowl even on stormy days!





GRANTS/MARKETING REPORT AUGUST 2024

BENDIGO BANK INDOOR GREEN

CSRFF has been assessed, and the COM has committed 1/3rd of the funding for the Project.DLGSC cannot support the Upgrades of playing surfaces for this round of grants. The Carpet is currently being sourced from the UK.

B GREEN & REMAINING INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT

Working with the City of Mandurah and the DLGSC on remaining infrastructure Projects Including:

- Upgrade of "B" Green surface to Synthetic.
- Harvest Rainwater off the South Roof of the Indoor Green.
- Replacement of the Shade shelters to all Greens.
- Provision of a Water Fountain on "A" Green.

The funding model for this large project will be discussed with our Management Committee and funding partners over the coming months.

REVISE THE GREENS/INFRASTRUCTURE SECTION OF THE MANAGEMENT PLAN

I have revised the Greens/Infrastructure section of the Management Plan to reflect the current position of green renewal. I have included a Synthetic surface for "B" Green in 2025.

EVEREST OF BOWLS

Currently working on an **Event Grant with the City of Mandurah** and a **Regional Events Grant from the**

DLGSC to cover expenses regarding the running of the Everest of Bowls, this would include First Aid Training and portable Toilets, promotional material, Extra seating and hire of the function room for the duration of the event.

DISABILITY ACCESS GRANT


